MINIMUM SETUP

- Webmaster who is on-call & responsive
 - Website not static
 - At least monthly updates
 - Has a modicum of customer service
- Follow published CWRT policies
- Allow only content that meets CWRT mission
- Compliance with copyright laws
- Display & follow your privacy policy
- If e-commerce, include tax rate in pricing, refund and cancellation policies and contact form



MINIMUM SETUP - CONTINUED

- Consider SSL certificate for data security
- Consider cookies policy & consent notice
- Cross-browser compatibility
- Site search capability
- Responsiveness (Optimized for mobile)
- Intuitive navigation
- Minimized page load time
- Link from website to donor base (CMS)
- Standardized branding (Logo, etc.)
- Impactful photographs

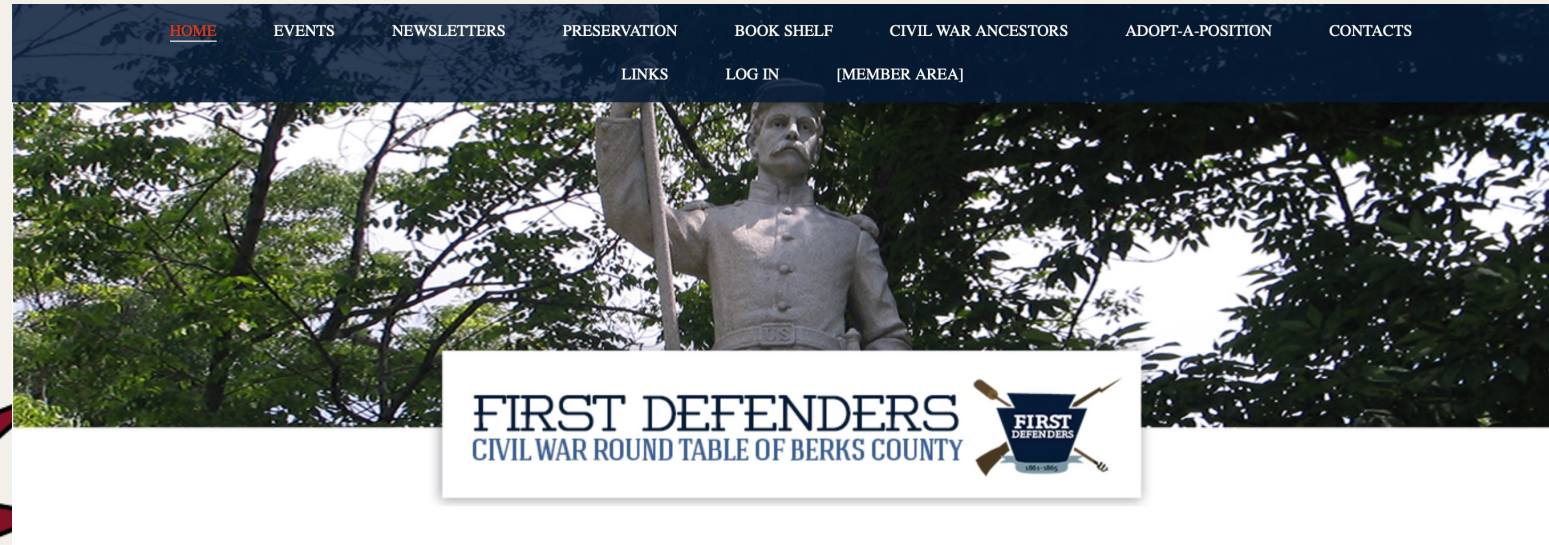
