



LITTLE ROUND TOP AT GETTYSBURG

A Reassessment of July 2, 1863

Little Round Top. Three words that resonate in American military history. It was there, at one of the most visited sites on the Gettysburg battlefield, that Confederates under Maj. Gen. John B. Hood tried to turn the left flank of the Army of the Potomac. Only the supreme efforts of Col. Strong Vincent's brigade and a handful of others, including Brig. Gen. Gouverneur K. Warren and Cols. Patrick O'Rorke and Joshua Chamberlain, saved the high ground and potential disaster for the Union army. This is the first full-length-in-depth treatment of this complex bloody affair in two decades.
